U3A's New Premises

As we settle comfortably into A1 in Ronan Street, Vincent, we can reflect on the reason our branch found themselves needing to move our office again. The electrical wires running to D Block and other buildings on the Fulham Road side had the copper stripped from the wires and stolen. We were no longer able to operate our D4 office space. The new owners of the complex are in Brisbane and over many calls and many days we negotiated with them about suitable space for us to use. They agreed to us using part of the A1 block, that had laid unoccupied for the past ten years. Over subsequent days, with the help of many volunteers, we moved our furniture and equipment between the two locations. There was some difficulty in dealing with the owners remotely and hold ups with getting multiple keys for the tutors and committee members. As a result, the unfortunate outcome was the closure of the Vincent operations for three weeks. All the members who have been in the new space have been impressed with the generous rooms we now have.

We held our Annual General Meeting in the large classroom. We look forward to a fresh start with the recommencement our classes at Vincent. Our current Lease is until end of June. During last few years we have found ourselves moving a few times and we are hopeful we will remain in A1 for the foreseeable future as the new owners carry out the planning to convert the complex to an older persons care home. How long that process may take is anyone's guess. In the meantime, we can enjoy the space we now occupy.

GLIMPSES OF THE PAST Margaret Hooper's memories

I am almost 92, which means I grew up in a very different era to today's young people. I would like to share some childhood memories with you.



When I was nine years old, dad went share-farming in Allora, with my aunt, who had been recently widowed. As the eldest, I drove a horse and sulky to school with my sister and two cousins. There was horse paddock at school, so the big boys would unharness the horse and harness her again in the afternoon.

Before I went to school I had to milk nine cows by hand. I still remember how I hated being woken by dad while it was still dark to do the milking.

One day when I was riding to school the horse shied at a train. I fell off and she trampled on my forehead. I carried on to school and spent the day lying in the dormitory. Mum and dad made me ride home.

While in Allora, two girls were evacuated from boarding school in Townsville to Allora convent, because of the war. Quite an experience for 10-year-olds. Their names were Shirley O'Sullivan and Maragret Rail. They could even be reading this newsletter! We had air raid trenches in the school yard, and we had air raid drill. When the war ended, we were in Warwick and I remember the church bells ringing.

Some of the games we played were queenie-o, hide and seek, what's the time Mr Wolf, brandings, hopscotch and skipping.

Growing up there was no TV, so we had singsongs around the pianola. Dad loved music. I still have the pianola cabinet where the rolls were kept.

As a teenager I went to lots of country dances. The whole family used to go. The ladies made a delicious supper, while the men played euchre and the littlies slept on the floor. Prior to getting married there was a Gift Evening (Dances) and the couple received the proceeds. I don't remember how much we got.

I look forward to reading other people's stories.
